After departing Ariah Park at 6.00am we travelled to Jerilderie for morning tea and then on to Bendigo. We tried our hands at making some pottery creations at Bendigo Pottery before boarding the Talking Tram for a tour around Bendigo's historic buildings. After this we donned hard hats and torches and went 61 metres down the Central Deborah Mineshaft to get an idea of life as a miner in the 1850s. We then travelled to Bendigo where, after unpacking all our gear at the Miner's Retreat Motel, we went up the road for dinner before watching the Spectacular night show 'Blood On the Southern Cross', a reenactment of the events leading up to and culminating in the Eureka Stockade. The following morning, it got quite chilly. Our first visit was to the Ballarat Wildlife Park where we were able to meet closeup a whole host of Australian native animals and reptiles. We then ventured to Sovereign Hill to gain an insight into life on the goldfields. After another delicious meal at the Eureka Stockade

## **APCS Swimming Carnival 2012 – Permission Note**

The school may also assess the student in completing a Water Survival Challenge to help determine their aquatic proficiency in this assessment.
