#### **World Diabetes Day (WDD)**

Last Wednesday, 14<sup>th</sup> November, APCS celebrated World Diabetes Day - the birthday of Frederick Banting who, along with Charles Best, first conceived the idea which led to the discovery of insulin in 1922. Students made a gold coin donation and raised \$153.20. This money will be donated to Diabetes Australia.

The World Diabetes Day campaign is led by the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) and its member associations. WDD engages millions of people worldwide in diabetes advocacy and awareness.

World Diabetes Day was created in 1991 by the International Diabetes Federation and the World Health Organization in response to growing concerns about the escalating health threat that diabetes poses. The campaign draws now attention to issues of paramount importance to the diabetes world and keeps diabetes firmly in the public spotlight.

Diabetes imposes life-long demands on the 250 million people now living with the disease, and their families. People with diabetes must deliver 95% of their own care, so it is of paramount importance that they receive ongoing, high-quality diabetes education that is tailored to their needs and delivered by skilled health professionals. In addition, IDF estimates that over 300 million people worldwide are at risk of type 2 diabetes. (Information taken from the IDF WDD website).
