
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Principal Report

Secondary News

Stage 4

Last week in Stage 4, students focused on their ability to work scientifically. Students learnt the science behind making slime. The students had to devise their own method and record their results. Students participated in a second practical to strengthen their understanding of working scientifically and made bath bombs. Students had to refine their method to achieve their desired bath bomb design. Students had to discuss the problems they encountered along the way and suggest an improvement for each of the problems they encountered. The students ability to write a practical report has improved

significantly (see collage).

Transition Day

On Friday students in Year 6 attended the Transition Day into Year 7. Students participated in a range of activities throughout the day. In Science, students learnt how to work scientifically and were involved in a number of practicals. The first practical students were involved in was the Floating Tea Bag Practical. Students learnt that hot air rises because it is lighter than the

surrounding air. Once the tea bag cooled down, it fell back to the ground because it became denser. The second practical students conducted was a density practical. They looked into the amount of sugar in a series of soft drinks. Students concluded that the more sugar a can of soft drink has, the denser it is. They came to this conclusion by putting: Zero Coke, Diet coke, Normal Coke, Fanta and Sprite into water. They found that the Zero and Diet coke floated because it has no sugar in it. It was a great day and I look forward to continuing to teach the Year 6 group next year (see collage).
