#### Stage 4 and 5 PDHPE and PASS

This Term in Stage 4 PDHPE we have been studying Nutrition and Eating Habits. As a part of their assessment task students have been researching the of excessive long impact term consumption of salt and sugar. In doing this, we researched some of our favourite sweet and savoury treats. Students were surprised to find just how much sugar and salt we consume when we enjoy our "sometimes" foods. The collage at the back of the newsletter shows the actual sugar content of a single serve of some of our favourite sweet treats and drinks. Stage 4 have discovered that even by indulging in one sweet treat a day we may be putting ourselves in the excessive sugar consumption category. This was a scary discovery when we discussed the impact on our lifestyles.

Stage 5 PDHPE have been working hard on learning all about road safety and road rules that apply specifically to them as Provisional and Learner Drivers. Stage 5 have been surprised by some of the road statistics for young people and researched ways we can address the common issues for young people on the road. Stage 5 have worked hard this term with an in class assessment item every fortnight since Week 6. They have applied themselves with diligence to these tasks and should be commended on their effort.

Stage 5 PASS have been building on our Term 2 Coaching unit by delving into the realm of Fundamental Movement Skills. This topic has allowed us to consider a variety of concepts including the breakdown of skills and how we can transfer skills both positively and negatively in sport. Last week we enjoyed the sunshine on Thursday and practised our High Jump skills. We applied what we have been learning in class to breakdown the skill and apply new techniques.
