STEM

Primary students in Year 1 and 2 have been extremely interested in Science and have been coming across to the secondary side to conduct Science experiments during the second half of lunch. This week, students learnt about how dishwashing liquid causes milk and food dye to disperse. This is due to the soap reducing the surface tension of the milk when it reacts with the fat and causes the particles to move creating swirls of colour (see collage).

Got It! Program

Getting On Track In Time

Got It! is a unique and exciting early intervention program rolling out in Years K – 2, in primary schools across NSW as a partnership between NSW Heath and Education. The aim of the program is to support and develop children's social and emotional skills, behaviour and well-being. **Got It!** is made up of two programs run through the school, *Fun FRIENDS* and *Exploring Together*.

Fun FRIENDS is a social and emotional learning program that all K – 2 students will take part in. This will be delivered in the classroom by teachers that have received the Fun FRIENDS training, and is made up of a whole lot of fun activities like drawing, yoga, puppet play, story-telling and group games.

Some parents will have opportunity to participate in the more targeted *Exploring Together* program. This program is made up of 10 sessions over 10 weeks where children, parents, teachers and clinicians work together to address any developing emotional and behavioural problems. This part of the **Got It!** program will be implemented by the Murrumbidgee Local Health District **Got It!** Team.

In the coming weeks, parents and carers of 2019 Year 1-2 students will receive a survey called the *Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire (SDQ)*. If you have a child starting Kindergarten in 2020, we will be in touch early next year with surveys for those new students once they have settled in.

This is a great opportunity to consider how your children are going in managing their emotions, behaviour and peer relationships at school and at home.

We look forward to working with you in 2020!

Raffle for Carnival: A raffle is also being put together for Carnival Day.






