Stage 4 Science

Over the last few weeks, students in Stage 4 have learnt about the difference between quantitative and qualitative data. Students conducted a series of experiments that required them to make observations. Students worked on determining the variables that would be measured, changed and controlled. They also went through the different measurement units and equipment used in Science and will have a practical write up handed out in Week 5 that will be due in Week 8.

Stage 5 Science

Over the last few weeks, students in Stage 5 have been learning about the difference between prokaryotic and eukaryotic cells. Students have explored infectious diseases and non-infectious diseases and have discussed examples of each. They have also learnt about the three lines of defence and what happens in each. Students will have an examination in Week 9 that tests their understanding of terms and concepts taught this term.


Stage 3 Science
