Principal's Report

Dear Families,

Over the last few weeks, I have been discussing the HSC and the challenges that have been faced by our Year 12 students. We are all aware that our school participates in an Access Program, the Riverina Access Partnership (RAP). As a member of RAP, our school partners with 5 neighbouring central schools to deliver the HSC using a mix of face to face and virtual classes for Year 11 and 12 students. There are



many advantages for our RAP students, as well as a few challenges. It is clear that our students are able to achieve their educational goals through the RAP model. I am pleased and proud to announce that every student in our HSC class of 2021 with aspirations of attending university have been offered early entry into the course of their choice. Our students have accepted the following university offers:

Kindra: Bachelor of Medical Radiation Science at Charles Sturt University

Jessica: Bachelor of Zoology at the University of New England

Rafferty: A double degree at the Australian National University

Tom: Bachelor of Business and Agriculture at Charles Sturt University

Through application and the support of their teachers across RAP, all of our students are able to reach their post school goals. This includes further education, apprenticeships, employment or even travel.

Last week we introduced changes to the organisation for students in the playground. This was introduced in compliance with the DoE guidelines on “cohorting” in schools. All schools in NSW are required to reduce the mixing of different age groups in a school. This measure reduces the chance of a COVID infection spreading through an entire school if a student does become infected. It is important that we do everything possible to look after and protect our students across the school.

This is particularly true while HSC examinations are taking place. Our HSC students have had 2 years of disruption to their studies and this move will reduce the risk that their HSC examinations will also be interrupted by COVID. I appreciate the support of both our students and families while cohorting is required in our school. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

This morning, the Minister for Education and NESA announced the launch of a new K – 2 English and Mathematics syllabus. These are the first of the new syllabuses that will be released as part of NESA's review into the NSW Curriculum Review. The two new syllabuses will first be taught in 2023 to give schools time to prepare and plan for the new content. Recently our primary students have also participated in the new Phonics Test, designed to give teachers reliable data on our student's literacy skills. Results from these tests will help us plan student learning for the remainder of 2021 and 2022.

A quick reminder that everyone in our school community is invited to participate in the Tell Them from Me Survey. We are asking all our parents and friends to participate in the survey and provide us with valuable information on how our school is performing in a wide variety of areas. Honest, reflective feedback allows us to understand where we are going well and which areas need further work to improve our performance. Year 2 loved sharing their persuasive writing with the class.

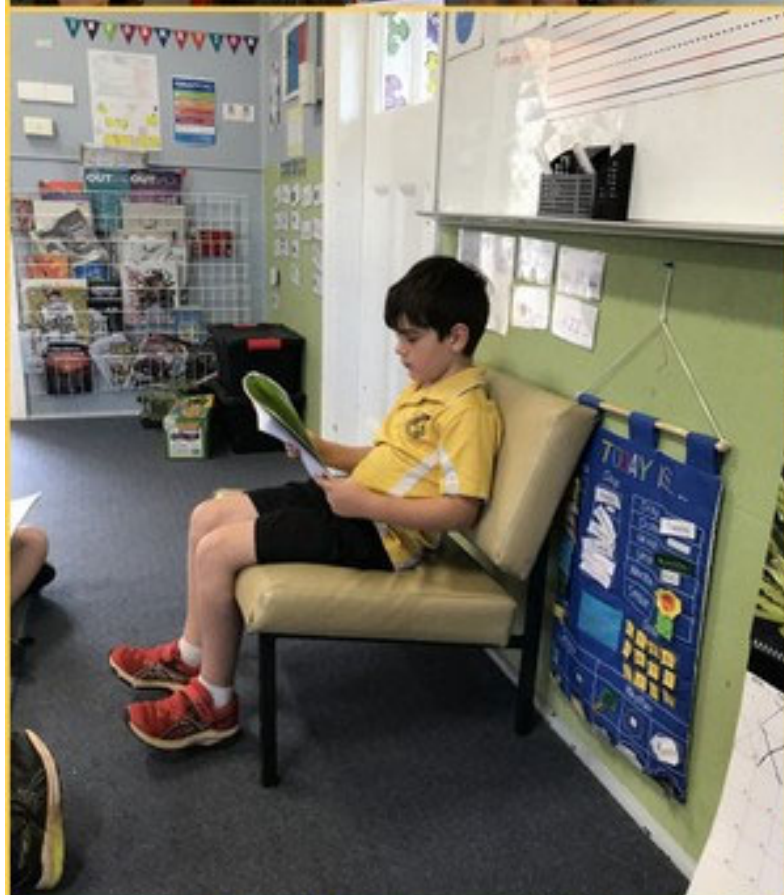
Year 3/4 have been writing narrative poems and using poetic devices such as alliteration, onomatopoeia, rhyme, repetition and descriptive language in their writing.

Stage 5 Work Education

This semester in Work Education, Stage 5 has completed a Workplace Environments unit and are currently studying workplace rights and responsibilities.

During the Workplace Environment unit in Term Three, the students investigated different types of businesses, effective workplace relations, workplace inductions, the Anti-discrimination Act, workplace equality and the gender pay gap. This unit was done mostly via remote learning, where students showed much dedication and resilience.

In Term Four we are studying workplace rights and responsibilities. This is a very practical unit for students looking to enter the workforce in the new year and beneficial for students already working part time. It involves looking at pay rates, ways to promote a positive work culture and applying for a tax file number and superannuation account. At the end of each lesson students are given a scenarios card of a problem that may occur in the workplace, usually involving an ethical or moral dilemma. Students have had quality discussion whilst sharing opinions and trying to solve the real-world issues.

In Week 7 we have a webinar with a representative from the Australian Tax Office to help students understand all they need to know about superannuation and tax returns, and paying tax as an employee and business owner.

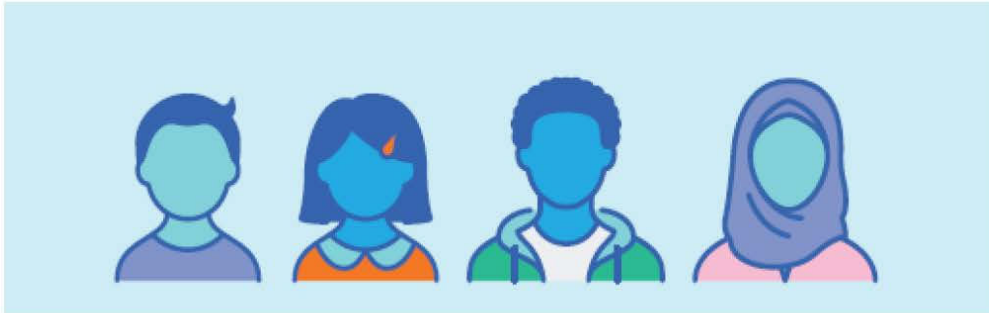
