Principal's Report

Dear Families,

Last week saw the start of our orientation programs for students starting Kindergarten and Year 7 at Ariah Park Central School in 2022. Students from the Pre-school came to APCS for a morning where they toured the school and participated in their first classroom lesson. They enjoyed playing on the big play equipment and joined in with counting, play dough, sorting and alphabet activities. I was



fortunate enough to spend some time with them and know they had a really enjoyable time at our school. We look forward to their next orientation visit.

Last week also saw our Year 6 students participating in a Year 7 transition program. The students participated in normal secondary lessons, learning what it is like to be a secondary student. It was a great experience for all the students who were involved, and I know they enjoyed the new experience.

As a school, we are also busy completing a number of major projects to prepare for 2022. We are investing in upgrades to our assets and furniture that support teachers, students and learning. As we continue to build our understanding of Aboriginal Culture, we have installed some Aboriginal artwork and artifacts in the foyer area of the school. A new barista machine for our café and a new metals mill for the TAS area have been ordered and will be installed. The sound and cabling in the Hall are being upgraded to support students in their performing arts activities. We are also upgrading furniture in a variety of primary and secondary rooms. These are important investments for our school.

As I have noted previously, the first step in "playing the game" is to turn up, ready to play. Throughout the year, we have been highlighting the importance of regular attendance for all students. There are clear links between regular attendance at school and good learning outcomes. There are a very limited number of reasons students can be away from school, including illness. It continues to be important that we look after each other by not attending school if we are ill. The Department of Education Attendance Policy is clear, if a student is absent from school without an acceptable reason, the absence is recorded as unjustified and will appear on the student's report as unjustified. This includes students being absent for events such as holidays, their birthday celebration, shopping, going to the hairdresser, working for parents etc. Please contact the school if your child is going to be absent and we will give advice on whether the absence will be recorded as justified, leave or unjustified.

Dear Year 10 Parents / Caregivers,

Re: Year 10 into Year 11 Transition Information

- 1. Advanced Mathematics: An introductory program for Year 11 Mathematics Advanced began Friday Period 2 Week 5 and should continue in that Friday slot for the rest of the term. This gives students the opportunity to see just what is expected of higher level Mathematics before they begin the course formally in 2022.
- 2. Week 9 Transition lessons for Year 10: Due to the unusual circumstances of this year, the usual Term 4 RAP Study Day, to which Year 10 is invited to attend as an introduction, will not take place. Instead, there will be a series of targeted lessons for some subjects in Week 9, according to the following timetable. These will run via Microsoft Teams, which will be the main platform used for RAP lesson delivery in 2022.

- 3. Paper Subject Selection forms: In Term 3, students made their subject selections online. Later, these may had had some modification, due to availability of subject choices. The paper version, outlining your child's final subject choices, should have been sent home for you to check and sign last week. We would appreciate these being returned your child's home school as soon as possible.
- 4. RAP Study Camp: At the beginning of each year, the Riverina Access Partnership holds an Induction Camp for RAP students, which is designed to introduce students to the Riverina Access Partnership and to help them in their transition to Stage 6 studies. Students will meet their peers across the 6 schools within the partnership and will also meet their subject teachers face-to-face. The Excursion letter will be sent out towards the end of this term.
