




















Young School of Music



Enjoy the holiday break, stay safe and we look forward to seeing students back at school at the beginning of Term 4.






Year 3/4



Henri Matisse By Art Critic Georgia McCormack

Henri Matisse was a French artist who was known for his use of colour. He also was known as a draughtsman printmaker, sculptor, and primarily as a painter. In one of Matisse's last decades, he deployed a couple of simple materials like white paper and gouache to create works of a wide range of colours and complexity. A pair of scissors was the tool Matisse used to transform paint and paper into a world of plants, animals, figures, and shapes.



This artwork is called The Sheaf.

The size of this artwork is 2.94m x 3.5m

The date of The Sheaf when it was created was 1953.

This was done with Gouache on paper, cut and pasted on the background than was put on Canvas.

The gallery it was presented in was Van Gogh Museum.

Features: Some features of this painting are that he uses lots of different colours. He also used gouache paper cut-outs and pasted them onto a canvas. The texture of this painting is a bit rough although at the same time smooth due to the collaged coloured paper. The shape of it is a square-shaped canvas and the images on the canvas are organic leaf shapes.

Review Critiquing: My review of this artist is that he is a good artist. He put lots of texture, lines, tone into his artworks. My opinion towards his artworks is that I like his them. They are very good and he has taken a lot of care with them. It would have taken him so many hours, days, months, and years to do all his artwork. It would have been months or years even before he finished his very first artwork. He would have created many sketches to get them right.
