


Principal's Report



The Ariah Park Redbacks have once again spun a web on their opposition with a comprehensive 8-wicket win against the Gordon Winkley Warriors (Temora) at Ariah Park on Saturday.

The Redbacks were on the back-foot early with a six and a four struck off the first 2 balls by the Warriors. However, this early onslaught was gradually overcome with some accurate bowling by all the Redbacks bowlers to restrict the run rate.

The Warriors finished with 91 runs off their 30 overs with Leo Furphy, Hayden Walsh, Fletcher Davey and Jim Donoghue standing out in a very economical all-round bowling display.

In reply, the Redbacks chased down the total at a rapid pace, reaching the target of 91 in just 11 overs! Cooper Herden and Jobe Davey continued their excellent form with a 71-run opening partnership, with Cooper retiring on 51 and Jobe making 27.

The Redbacks will face their biggest challenge yet next round when they play the undefeated Nimbus Young in Young on Saturday.

In other cricket news, Joe Furphy top scored with 26 for the Temora Thunder U16s against Signs r Us Young on Saturday.
