Year 3-11 Excursion—Camp Wombaroo

With only one week left before our end of year excursion, Miss Saffy, Ms Greenlees, Miss Evans, Mr Johnston, Mrs Irvine, Mr Moffatt, and Mr Crouch are all very excited to be attending this year's excursion with students.

Students will have a variety of different activities over the 3 days in their groups. Please ensure that students have appropriate clothing as per the packing list attached.

Students will be departing from school on Monday 12 December at **exactly 7am**. Please ensure that students are here **at 6:45am**, so we can pack the bus and mark roles. If students have medication and have completed the **Medications Permission Form**, this can be given to Mr Johnston or Miss Saffy before getting on the bus. Students will be arriving back to school on Wednesday 14 December at approximately **6:30 – 7pm** depending on a variety of factors.

If for any reason, students are running late/early arriving home, parents will be notified via School Stream and Facebook, so please keep an eye on these platforms.

Students will need to bring a packed lunch, water bottle and morning tea with them for the first day. All stops for bathroom breaks will not be in areas where students will be able to spend money.

Medications

Any child that requires medication whilst on the excursion must have a **Medications Permission form filled in and sent back to the front office prior of going on the excursion.** A medication schedule needs to be developed to ensure that each child receives their medication at the correct time. This includes any medication your child takes whether a prescription is required or not.

All medication must be provided to Melissa Saffy or another teacher attending on the morning of the excursion. <u>If we do not have the correct</u> <u>permission form completed, your child will be unable to take the</u> <u>medication on the excursion.</u>

Camp Wombaroo have also for their records requested a medical form to be completed if your child has any dietary requirements. This form was attached in the online permission note you were sent.
